Dear Pittsburg Community,

Thank you for your continued support for all of our scholars! Over the years, we have done much work in updating and replacing our school facilities. We take great pride in making sure our scholars have the best learning environments. For example, we added the P-Building of 30 classrooms at Pittsburg High School, we added a multi-purpose room and Library at Willow Cove Elementary, we replaced Parkside Elementary School, we replaced portables at Los Medanos Elementary School with a new building, and we are in the process of replacing Hillview Junior High School.

PUSD is in the process of updating our priorities for our future facilities work. We still have a number of our schools that need upgrades and where we need to replace portables with permanent buildings, like we did at Los Medanos. We also need to plan for potentially adding additional classrooms or a new school facility or facilities to accommodate the additional housing being built in the City of Pittsburg.

Local Funding for School Improvements

The State does not provide dedicated funding for school facility improvements, so repairs and upgrades must be funded locally. The PUSD Board of Trustees is currently considering placing a \$140 million school facilities improvement bond measure on the November 5, 2024 ballot for local voters to consider. Locally controlled funding from the measure could be used to:

- **★** Fix leaky roofs
- Improve school safety and security
- ☀ Update classrooms and labs for math, science, reading, and writing instruction
- * Replace aging portables with permanent classrooms
- Provide classrooms and school facilities to prevent student overcrowding
- Provide up-to-date learning technology
- * Replace outdated and inefficient heating, cooling, electrical, and plumbing systems
- Improve accessibility for students with disabilities

Strict Fiscal Accountability and Local Control

A local school facilities improvement bond measure would require strict fiscal accountability protections, including:

- No funds could be taken away by the State or used for any purpose other than upgrading local Pittsburg schools
- * A detailed project list indicating projects that could be funded by the measure
- * A Citizens' Oversight Committee and independent audits to ensure funds are spent as promised
- Required public disclosure of all spending
