City of Pittsburg and Pittsburg Unified School District Team-up for Clean-up on Civic Pride Day

Civic Pride Day is a new annual event developed by the City of Pittsburg and Pittsburg Unified School District. The goal of the event is to bring community volunteers together, to help remove litter from nearby parks, schools, and the downtown waterfront area.

"Civic Pride Day ties into our green initiatives at Pittsburg Unified School District," said Matt Belasco, Director of Maintenance, Operations, and Transportation, Pittsburg Unified School District. "We are working with students at school sites to encourage them to be proactive in the fight against litter by changing behaviors "We want them to recognize the importance of proper waste disposal. They start with 'Pitt Pride' in their own schools and hopefully that will cascade to the committee, making Pittsburg an even more beautiful city where trash is in its place."

"Civic Pride Day is just that – a day to take pride in our community and clean up unwanted litter," said Laura Wright, City of Pittsburg. "We are hoping this will engage the community in the discussion and education to stop litter in our community by changing behavior and taking action; cleaning out pickup beds before driving, walking a few extra feet to place garbage in a receptacle, not dropping water bottles, wrappers or cigarettes, and much more. We are hoping this event will bring action and change to get more people and our students involved in the effort to keep this beautiful City clean."
