Pittsburg Unified School District and Pittsburg Chamber of Commerce Collaborate on Two Career Centered Programs for Students

Pittsburg Chamber of Commerce and Pittsburg Unified School District collaborate to offer career fair and mock-interview opportunities to high school students. The two events are on separate dates (Wednesday, 4/25 and Friday, 4/27) and will feature volunteers and business owners focused on helping high school students prepare for the job force.

On Wednesday, April 25, 2018, dozens of local business owners will be at Pittsburg High School's gymnasium, located at 1750 Harbor Street, Pittsburg, for the CareerLINK Expo. They will be offering advice and job opportunity information to 1,500 high school students from Pittsburg High and Black Diamond High from 7:45AM – 1:30PM. From 12:30PM – 1:30PM, two speakers will be addressing the audience. Karen Sakata, County Superintendent of Schools of Contra Costa County will give a message on Career Technical Education in the County and the State. Dr. Janet Schulze, Superintendent of Pittsburg Unified School District will present a State of the District message.

On Friday, April 27, 2018, volunteers will conduct mock-interviews for students, helping them have a better understanding of the interview process, tips for success, and suggestions on do's and don'ts during interviews. This event will take place at Pittsburg High, 1750 Harbor Street, Pittsburg from 8:00AM – 3:00PM in the Little Gym.

The goal of the two events is to help prepare students for life after high school and

what to expect when applying for a job or entering a career path.

"Students need to explore possible career options, and businesses need to hire and build their future employee pipelines, said Todd Whitmire, Principal at Pittsburg Unified School District. The CareerLINK Expo meets both of those needs by linking future employees and employment opportunities. It's critical for high school students to have opportunities to explore various careers and find out what skills and education are required, as well as what the work environment is like in those career paths. The Expo is a casual and friendly environment suited for these kinds of conversations. We are very appreciative of our partners for supporting our students!"
