### 6. Comments

### 6.01 Public Comments: Items Not on the Agenda

Marzel Price – regarding the Junior Warriors basketball league, the league serves children ages 6-15 and has been active in this community for a very long time. The league reserved space at Rancho Medanos Jr. High with staff in March of this year. There were some concerns about student misconduct and the Jr. Warriors were denied use of the facility. The league has spent a large amount of money in preparation for the start of this season. "We are asking the board to reverse the principal's decision and allow use of the facility".

Bryon Walker - spoke on behalf of the Jr. Warriors program, he stated that lots of other youth groups also use the facility – and it could have been others who created the problem. These types of programs helped develop these young boys into men, and it would be wrong to not have a place for them.

George Perkins – a coach with the Junior Warriors, the program has been a success in developing citizenship, reducing crime, etc. The issues that caused a problem were contractual and some issues regarding clean-up and security; but all of this was handled. There were children that lingered about from other programs as well, and they may have contributed to the problem.

Curtis Flucus - kids love the Jr. Warriors, parents love the Jr. Warriors, and we should not have been pushed out.

This was a misunderstanding with the Principal and there should have been a conversation that lead to a better agreement.

### 6.02 Student Board Member Comments (Ms. Elam)

- we met with some freshmen students to help them log in and better understand the Aries system
- leadership did a great job with decorating for the first home game
- this Friday is Powder Puff, there will be a rally and lots more decorations

### 6.03 Superintendent Comments (Dr. Schulze)

- Dr. Schulze thanked the Human Resources staff for organizing the employee Health and Benefits Fair last Monday. Employees had lots of opportunities to get information on health, wellness, retirement, investments and other incentives. A reminder that open enrollment for benefits ends on Friday, October 6.
- I officially completed all my school visits last week and had some great conversations with the teachers and administrative staff.
- The state department just released our CAASPP results today, we will have a full presentation at the next board meeting.

### 6.04 Board Member Comments (Trustees)

Dr. Canciamilla - I visited PHS, spoke with Mr. Whitmire and toured the campus. Saw one of the student fights and was pleased to see how quickly staff resolved it. Also met with 9th grade teachers about mentoring for them. Visited with Ms. Barbee at PHS north campus and talked about the afterschool program. Went to the Budget Subcommittee that same evening where we discuss the budget and the unaudited actuals that are on tonight's agenda. Went to the Curriculum Subcommittee meeting yesterday, discussed the AP surveys and the high school master schedule. I want to recognize the hard work that was done in order to give us that information. The master schedule is much more balanced this year, the freshman classes are lower and that should help with their transition. Got a lot of information from the committee meeting.

Mr. Miller - this past week I had a good conversation with our PEA President, Tammy Carr. Then went to visit PHS and met the new Assistant Principal, Ted Alfaro, he is very good with the students and was pleasant to talk to. I want to commend Mr. Palacios on getting the new campus built. I visited the new classrooms while I was there, and it looks great.

Mr. Woolridge – I also attended the Budget Subcommittee meeting with Dr. Canciamilla and heard about the GANN Limits. We talked about possibly having a budget study session. Also attended the Curriculum Subcommittee meeting. There was a lot of good information and we learned details about the master schedule and the A/P survey; it was great to hear from the student. Both sub committees had discussions on board policy review, and I'm looking forward the policy sessions.

Mr. Smith - visited Foothill Elementary with the principal and Vice Principal, saw some of the special Ed classes there and dual immersion classes. Also met with our PEA president, Ms. Carr - and had a good casual conversation.

### 7. Information / Reports / Discussion

# 7.01 Presentation from the staff and students that traveled to Shimonoseki, Japan (Mr. Palacios)

Mr. Palacios introduced the students and Ms. Estrada who attended the Japan trip. The students described an exciting visit and expressed that they learned a great deal out the culture and communication without language. The students are still in communication with the Japan families and many hope to return there one day.

## 7.02 Construction and Facilities Planning Update (Mr. Holtslander)

Mr. Holtslander – Willow Cove Elementary: he presented northeast views of the new building, front views of the finished exterior, and flooring which should be completed next week. Exterior views of the new roof and covered courtyard. The Site Support Services Center: views of the electrical ports for the new vehicle charging stations. The infrastructure for this project was funded through a grant. The charging station will be installed at Site Support Services Center, Pittsburg High School, and the District Office with 4 stations available for public use.

Mr. Strom – with Board approval this will be the 9<sup>th</sup> year that PHS has attended this event. This is a large event with hundreds of teams in attendance. It provides great exposure for our student athletes and often develops into

### 10.01 Comments from the Public, Community Organizations, Employee Representatives

Irwin Manangkil - representing PEA, looking forward to meeting with each of the board members individually. There was a recent shooting death over the weekend that effected the Black Diamond school community. In dealing with our concerns about mental health (and we love our Lincoln Center staff), we would greatly appreciate a full time onsite School Physiologist at Black Diamond High School. We are a small school, but we are disproportionately affected by trauma.

Ms. Alexander – regarding the propane busses – I missed the board meeting when it was originally presented; hearing that they are going to be propane buses is a concern because propane can explode. The training for staff on theses buses - seems to be a very short learning experience. The parent educator conference is in southern California this year and CSEA will be sending staff. Also we need to start having intruder evacuations so that everyone is well prepared.

### 11. Board Requests

### 11.01 Information Requests

Ms. Elam – we know that graduation rates are high, but I heard that many seniors don't go to college anymore or they are not ready when it's time to go. Wondering about our college acceptance / graduation rate.

Mr. Woolridge – follow-up with Ms. Gonzales about the number of teacher aide vacancies, has it changed? Still wondering about the number of copies a teacher can make at their site and how can they support the students with limited copies. Would like staff to take a look at AB261 - is that what we did with our student board member? (This is Tony Thurman's bill on student voting, he did a press release on it).

Mr. Miller - are teachers given a lesson on how to go into the Aries system to check their grades?

Dr. Canciamilla – would like to get information on the status of student fights at the high school and junior highs. Would like to explore some options for intruder training. Counselling triage - when we have emergencies at the sites how does Black Diamond fit into that – are they getting additional support?
